NGOs with Similar Services Pakistan	SPEAK is the sole organization which is providing HIV related services to migrants and their families in Pakistan. However, there are several NGOs based in Pakistan which are working on other migrant-related issues including Justice project Pakistan and Legal ID Pakistan. Apart from these, there are other organizations which are working only on HIV/AIDS among general population or have a component of HIV in their projects

Partnership Interest	Linkage to healthcare services in receiving country if a Pakistani migrant is HIV positive
Success Stories	SPEAK through its effective community mobilization helped many returnee and deportee migrants in providing them free HIV testing and access to the healthcare services. The most noteworthy are the success stories of Akbar Hussain and Jahanzeb Khan. These two are returnee migrants who were ignorant about their HIV status. Their health condition was deteriorating with no hope to look for. In their difficult times, SPEAK's field staff reached out to them and counselled them to get tested for HIV. After being diagnosed HIV positive, they were referred to the nearest ART centers for medical observation and treatment. Now they are living a healthy life.
